Specific information

Publications

All papers accepted for the conference will be considered for publication in one of the following reviewed academic publication:

- Journal “**Equilibrium**” – a periodical that is published by The Faculty of Economics and Management at Nicolaus Copernicus University.
- One of reviewed books that will be published after the conference.

All papers will be reviewed for the above publications following their normal review criteria. The acceptance of a paper to the conference is not a guarantee of publication in the journal or publication in a book.

These publications will be prepared after the conference till June 2010.

All conference papers will be included on publication supplied with an ISBN number. The publication will include abstract of the papers with Conference CD including full papers. The CDs will be distributed to all participants during the conference.

Submissions and Formatting Institutions

The papers should be submitted by 20 September 2009 electronically (MS Word) by e-mail titled “Conference” to pte@umk.pl. In second file please provide the following information: name of the author(s); affiliation, mailing address, telephone, and e-mail addresses of the author(s) and information whether the author wish to receive invoice by mail or during conference. Typescript

1. A typescript should met the following conditions:
 - 1.1. Word program, A4 format, all standard margins 2,3 cm, Times New Roman print, size: 12 points, space between lines: 1,5,
 - 1.2. Full paper should not exceed 12 pages, the minimum appreciated length of the paper is 20 000 marks.
 - 1.3. The article layout:

The name of the author (Times New Roman, 12)

Title of the paper (Times New Roman, 14, bold)

Key words: text max 200 words, (Times New Roman, 10)

Abstract

Abstract of 150-200 words should outline the background, methodology, data, results and main contribution of the paper (Times New Roman, 10, space between lines: 1)

Introduction (Times New Roman, 12, bold)

Introduction should outline the background, the aim of the paper

Paragraph

Paragraph

Conclusions

Literature

Please note that language editing and formatting of the paper(s) is the responsibility of the author(s).

Quotations

1. The following reference to literature can be used in the main text: a surname of an author of a work with the year of edition in brackets and number of pages, for example (Romer 1985, pp. 998-1020). If a joint publication is quoted, for example (Snowdon (ed.) 1998; Snowdon et al 1998, pp. 100-121 - if there are more than two editors or authors);
2. Writing texts which include mathematical symbols and formulas one should always use equation processor.

Literature

1. A list of literature should be placed at the end of the whole paper. Literature items should be arranged alphabetically. The following elements should be placed in a description of every literature item: (a surname and an initial of an author's first name, the title of a work (in italics), the name of a publisher, a place and a year of edition. An examples:
2. Bontemps C., Mizon G. E. (2001), *Congruence and Encompassing*, [in:] Stigum B. (ed.), *Studies in Economic Methodology*, Cambridge, Mass., MIT Press.
3. Hendry D. F. (2000), *Econometrics: Alchemy or Science?*, Oxford University Press, Oxford.
4. Nelson C. R., Plosser C. I. (1982), *Trends and Random Walks in Macroeconomic Time Series: Some Evidence and Implications*, „Journal of Monetary Economics”, Vol. 10, No. 3.
5. Poon S-H., Granger C. (2003), *Forecasting Volatility in Financial Markets: A Review*, „Journal of Economic Literature”, Vol. 19, No. 1.

Tables and drawings

1. Tables and drawings should be placed in the text as close to a place of citing as possible.
2. A source or information “the study based on” should be placed under table and drawing.
3. Tables and drawings together with a title and a source should be inside a text column
4. Times New Roman (10 points), single space, should be used for a text in a drawing.
5. Drawings should be prepared in Corel, Word or Excel with attached original file with editing possibility.

Program Outline

The conference place will be The Faculty of Economics and Management at Nicolaus Copernicus University in Toruń. The conference will begin in the morning of Friday, 20 October with a plenary session in the morning (10 a.m.), followed by parallel sessions until about 4 or 5 p.m. The day will end with Conference Dinner. Saturday will be devoted to parallel sessions until 2 or 3 p.m. All the above events plus lunch and coffee-breaks on both conference days, as well as conference publication with the Conference CD, are included within the participation fee. Accommodation, transportation and any other costs are excluded from the participation fee. However, the organizers are able to give assistance in finding and reservation of hotels.

Registration

We ask participants to register for the conference by 20 September 2009. The conference participation fee is 320 PLN (EUR 70) per participant.

The participation fee is payable by 20 September 2009 by means of bank transfer to the **Polish Economic Society Department in Toruń** bank account. After that date, participation is possible at a walk-in participation fee of 400 PLN, payable in cash on site during conference registration.
